- **Funding:** Project selected for pass-through financing. The PTF agreement was executed on May 10, 2013, and the initial payment of \$4,418,000.00 was made by Rockwall County on June 25, 2013. Payment of \$22,037,679.37 was transmitted to TxDOT in September 2014. Payment of \$2,697,499.67 was approved on February 25, 2015. Payment of \$4,372,697.99 was transmitted to TxDOT on June 28, 2016.

**Current (July) activities:** SEMA continues working on propose concrete pavement in various locations on the project. They also placed concrete riprap on the eastbound main lane entrance ramp. Finally, after switching eastbound traffic earlier this month, they began removing existing/detour pavement, constructing the westbound detour pavement, and moving barrier.

**Narrative description of last month's (June) activities:** Finished concrete paving on eastbound IH 30 main lanes and IH 30 ramp. Installed drainage south of IH 30 on FM 3549. Constructed traffic rail on IH 30 main lanes. Installed concrete riprap at IH 30 exit ramp.

**Narrative description of activities planned for next month (August):** SEMA will continue removing westbound existing/detour pavement and begin drilling shafts for bridge construction.

Plans for changes in traffic patterns: Westbound traffic switch expected to occur on August 1, 2018.

- DGNO Railroad Exhibit A: Railroad agreement executed on December 7, 2017.
- **Construction:** Project was awarded to Tiseo Paving Company on May 24, 2018. There are 458 working days and 22 months of barricades. Authorization to begin work received on July 19, 2018. The 90-day delay began on July 19, 2018, and will extend through mid-October or until utilities are clear of the first phase of construction, whichever comes first.
- **ROW:** Total number of parcels is 39. The two structure relocations have been completed. One sign relocation remains. This relocation is not expected to impact the utility relocation schedules. Relocation of the Exxon sign is pending approval of permit from City of Fate. As soon as permit is approved, relocation of sign should take 7-10 days. City of Fate did not grant permit for relocating existing Exxon sign. The FEC utility will have higher poles to clear existing Exxon sign. A new parcel added for the sign as an "improvements only" parcel (44X). Negotiations have been unsuccessful; request for ED has been made; will not affect letting, utility relocations, or construction. ED hearing for parcel 44X has been scheduled for July 27, 2018.
- Utility Coordination: Level B SUE is available. Extent of required relocations is being determined.
  - City of Rockwall: Relocations are complete.
  - NTMWD: New ROW overlaps a portion of NTMWD's 50' easement, which contains 84" pipe. NTMWD will leave pipe in place, but NTMWD spacing guidelines limit the utility installations in the vicinity of the 84" line to no closer than 5'. Discovered conflicts on SH 66 crossing at FM 3549. TxDOT is working with NTMWD to relocate a manhole and the 12" and 21" water lines. Estimated completion date is in early April 2019. The project will let with revised phasing to provide NTMWD time to relocate utilities.
  - Oncor and FEC: FEC has provided Area Office with rough draft of relocation plans; also waiting for ROW department to relocate Exxon sign conflicting with proposed aerials. FEC began relocations on October 9, 2017. To complete their relocations, FEC is awaiting Oncor completion. Oncor started setting poles on March 26, 2018. Oncor has finished aerial construction but still has some underground work to complete. Oncor and FEC will wreck out old poles once Suddenlink/Altice USA is relocated.
  - Atmos: Clear

- **Blackland WSC:** Blackland WSC has approved plans and permit. They are obtaining private easement for the construction of the relocated line. Construction began on April 18, 2018. Discovered a new section of line requiring relocation. Anticipate completion by mid-July 2018. New line requiring relocation has been mostly constructed (1,100 of the 1,700 feet), the contractor is awaiting the railroad permit, NTMWD approval for crossing the easement and an easement on the eastern corner of the I-30 service road/FM 3549.
- **AT&T:** Relocation plans were approved December 4, 2017. AT&T is currently approximately 90% complete. Contractor is awaiting the arrival of two custom vaults to finish relocations; then, splicing will finish within a couple of weeks.
- **Suddenlink:** All aerial facilities on FEC poles; therefore, Suddenlink will only be able to relocate once FEC and Oncor are complete. Suddenlink relocations plans approved on December 8, 2017. Relocations have begun. Aerial, underground, power supplies, and cabinets to set. Suddenlink will then wreck out old aerial lines.
- Sprint: Relocations complete
- **City of Fate:** Relocations complete
- Connextions Telcom: Clear
- Mt Zion WSC: Relocations complete
- All utilities requiring relocations were notified to have plans and an approved permit by September 2017, to begin relocation construction immediately after all ROW has been acquired, and to be complete by June 2018.

- **ENV:** HNTB continued developing environmental technical reports. Public meeting held on May 17, 2018. HNTB submitted draft public meeting summary to TxDOT for review on June 26, 2018.
- **ROW:** TxDOT completed the supplemental survey needed at SH 66. TxDOT is in the process of updating the previous ROW/parcel boundary survey.

- Held coordination meeting at TxDOT Dallas District on June 12, 2018, with Grey Stogner from Crestview Real Estate to discuss center median alternatives to access the Tom Thumb shopping center.
- HNTB submitted updated drainage report on June 13, 2018.
- HNTB submitted updated cost estimate on June 25, 2018.
- HNTB received additional schematic comments from the District. Final schematic submittal is expected to occur before end of July 2018.
- HNTB completed TxDOT CMAQ estimate and submitted on July 6, 2018.
- Communities along the corridor have been requested to submit letters of support for the schematic. Rockwall County and Fate have provided letters. Awaiting City of Rockwall's letter.
- Utilities: Subsurface utility engineering has been completed by TxDOT. Reviewed and provided comments to TxDOT for 2017 SUE on September 18, 2017.
- Other: AFA was executed by Rockwall County Commissioners Court on Tuesday, May 8, 2012. The AFA was executed by TxDOT on June 12, 2012.

- Utility Coordination: Atmos and City of Rockwall have performed their own Level A analysis and have submitted information to TxDOT to supplement CH2M's conflict analysis. CH2M submitted utility conflict analysis on June 23, 2016.
  - Suddenlink: Complete
  - **City of Heath:** Determined that 24" waterline from SH 205 and Townsend Drive will not be in conflict with proposed storm sewer.
  - **Oncor:** Permit approved on April 12, 2017. Oncor had to delay start of relocations due to hurricane efforts in Houston. Oncor began relocations on October 9, 2017. Commitments unrelated to Oncor's relocations at SH 276 have delayed their progress. Oncor has one remaining pole and four pole wreckouts to be completed by July 27, 2018.
  - **FEC:** FEC completed underground crossing construction. FEC returned to remove inactive poles once Charter-Spectrum and Zayo aerial attachments were removed. FEC has four poles to wreckout by July 27, 2018, to be complete.
  - City of Rockwall: Complete
  - Atmos: Complete
  - **AT&T:** AT&T began work during the week of September 11, 2017. AT&T is nearing the end of their relocations and expects to be complete by June 1, 2018. Commitments unrelated to AT&T's relocations at SH 276 have delayed their progress. AT&T has aerials on three Oncor poles and pedestals to wreck out by July 27, 2018, to be complete.
  - Charter Communications and Zayo: Zayo completed relocations in October 2017. Charter has removed old aerials from both old FEC and Oncor poles, allowing poles to be removed now. Charter is complete with relocations; however, splicing cables from old to new will take place on July 6, 2018. Charter has one splicing operation and fiber wreck out to take place on July 30, 2018, to be complete.
  - Connextions Telcom, RCH WSC, Blackland WSC, and Sprint: Complete
- **Construction:** The project let on April 4, 2018. The apparent low bidder is Ed Bell Construction at 6.13% over the engineer's estimate. There are 399 working days and 23 months of barricades. Project was awarded on April 26, 2018. Pre-construction meeting was held on July 12, 2018. Construction is expected to start on August 13, 2018.

- Schematic: Dannenbaum submitted schematic, hydraulic report, and cross sections on June 16, 2017, for District review. Received TxDOT comments. TxDOT has agreed to allow Dannenbaum to move forward with the culverts designed to 100-year event and update culverts if needed in the PS&E. Dannenbaum, TxDOT, Rockwall County, and City of Rockwall met on November 7, 2017, to discuss the 4-lane schematic exhibit.
- Dannenbaum finalized four hydraulic reports for the corridor and submitted February 26, 2018.
- Dannenbaum adjusted tie-in from existing FM 549 to proposed FM 549 to incorporate culvert improvements.
- Dannenbaum submitted 95% schematic for review to TxDOT on March 23, 2018. Awaiting updated traffic from TxDOT to run noise model to determine if there is a need for a noise wall for Lofland Farms Subdivision.
- TxDOT will be re-surveying project to provide updated topo. Schematic will not be updated for new topo.
- Awaiting TxDOT comments on 95% schematic and hydraulic report.
- ENV: Sub-consultant has completed their delineation and is finalizing the Scope Development Tool. Submitted for TxDOT review in March 2017. Dannenbaum met with TxDOT on February 16, 2018, to discuss environmental and schematic. TxDOT gave permission to proceed with the environmental for the corridor. Dannenbaum is coordinating with TxDOT PM and environmental liaison. Dannenbaum continued preparations for public meeting. Public meeting held Tuesday, June 26, 2018, at the Rockwall County Courthouse. There were 38 in attendance. Dannenbaum is coordinating with sub regarding public meeting responses. Environmental technical reports are underway.
- **PS&E:** Will be responsible for providing the PS&E once the schematic has been approved.

#### **<u>Current Activity</u>:**

- **Design:** Revised 30% schematic was submitted to TxDOT for review on June 29, 2017. Discussions occurred between Rowlett and engineer regarding expanding improvements to include ultimate widening of Dalrock Road into plans, as well as provide right-turn lanes and dual left-turn lanes on all approaches to the intersection. Comments on 30% design received from TxDOT on October 26, 2017. Surveyors collected additional survey needed to revise 30% schematic. The revised schematic was submitted to the city for review. The revised 30% plans showing the ultimate roadway configuration for Dalrock Road was submitted to TxDOT for review on June 29, 2018.
- Environmental: TxDOT will perform ENV work.
- Other: A meeting with COG, TxDOT, Rowlett, and ITS to discuss funding, project efforts, and TxDOT requirements was held on May 22, 2017. TxDOT will fund internal design review costs at 100%, perform ENV work, and let the project.
- On August 11, 2017, Rowlett, Commissioner Cantrell, and Michael Morris met to discuss funding. Commissioner Cantrell requested that funding for the project be in place before the end of 2018. The city is currently developing funding matrix. The city submitted the project to NCTCOG for addition to the TIP/STIP. RTC approved the TIP on May 10, 2018, to include the project. City has developed funding plan for project. Meeting with Commissioner Cantrell, Dallas County, and Michael Morris to discuss project was held on December 7, 2017. Meeting with Dallas County, Rockwall County, Rowlett, and ITS held on February 15, 2018. RTC approved the project as part of the 2017-2018 CMAQ/STBG Funding Program: Strategic Partnerships Program (Round 2) on June 10, 2018. Rowlett is working with Dallas County on the funding agreement and is preparing a TIP modification for submittal to NCTCOG.

- Halff submitted the 60% schematic to TxDOT for review on January 5, 2018. The 60% schematic has been reviewed by TxDOT, and comments were sent to Halff in mid-April 2018. Halff resubmitted the 90% schematic on July 9, 2018.

In order to approve schematic, TxDOT requires letters of support from communities along the corridor. Letters of support have been received from Rockwall County, Kaufman County, City of Rockwall, and City of Terrell. Letter of support is needed from McLendon-Chisholm.
- Environmental: Halff continues work on technical reports. One environmental technical report is outstanding. Conformity Report Form will be finalized after the STIP is approved, expected in November 2018.
- Draft EA was submitted on May 14, 2018. Draft EA is under concurrent review by both District and TxDOT ENV. Halff resubmitted draft EA for TxDOT review on June 20, 2018. Anticipate public hearing in September 2018.

- FNI discussed potential issues with the thoroughfare plan model run with NCTCOG staff on March 21, 2018. NCTCOG uses an older version of TansCAD, which may result in issues/additional work incorporating plan changes for the model run. NCTCOG suggested adding the Rockwall County Thoroughfare Plan model run to the Annual UPWP to ensure that NCTCOG can put the necessary resources and time into converting the model into a compatible format. FNI met with NCTCOG on May 9, 2018, to discuss revisions to the 2045 network for travel demand model run. FNI provided NCTCOG with a revised travel demand model which included the addition of major and minor arterials not currently included in the 2045 network. The revised Rockwall County Outer Loop alignment was also added, as was the Kaufman County alignment to provide a more accurate model output. FNI provided network amendments and additions to NCTCOG for the travel demand model run. The results of the revised model run were reviewed and returned to NCTCOG to correct model deficiencies that needed to be corrected for the model run.
- FNI continued reviewing roadway connectivity between adjacent cities and counties.
- FNI continued working on draft thoroughfare plan document.
- FNI completed cross sections for thoroughfare plan map.
- FNI continued updating County Thoroughfare Map.
- FNI reviewed revised travel demand model results and began incorporating results into the plan document.
