**Did you Gnow?** There is an app that can help you better keep track of your trash. When you download the Recycle Coach app (formerly known as My Waste), it can help remind you about trash and recycling collection days.

In addition to providing you with personalized collection schedules for web and mobile, the app provides an interactive tool to communicate trash issues with the City of Rockwall. If you experience service problems, you can snap a picture and send it straight to the Utility Billing Department. The City can also push out schedule updates as needed. # FALL IS RIGHT AROUND THE CORNER

It may not feel like fall yet, but September is the time to start preparing your landscape for the fall and winter months. Here are a few tips to help ensure you're ready for next spring:

- 1. Do not trim trees until all leaves have fallen
- 2. Raise your mowing height between  $\frac{1}{4}$  and  $\frac{1}{2}$
- 3. Apply pre-emergent and final application of fertilizer
