Bennie Daniels (pictured above, middle left) was reelected to Place 1, Kevin Fowler (pictured above, middle right) was reelected to Place 3, and Dana Macalik (pictured above, right) was reelected to Place 5. At the same meeting, Councilmember Macalik was selected as the Mayor Pro-Tem for the coming year.



Rockwall PD is "Recognized Law Enforcement Agency"

The Texas Police Chiefs Association has honored the Rockwall Police Department as a "Recognized Law Enforcement Agency." The Law Enforcement Recognition Program evaluates a Police Department's compliance with over 168 Best Business Practices for Texas Law Enforcement.

This voluntary process required the Rockwall Police Department to conduct a critical self-review of the agency's policies, procedures, facilities, and operations. Rockwall PD has received this award since 2011.

Did you Gnow? Rockwall has been officially designated in Austin as the *Free Live Music Capital of North Texas! So* it seems only fitting that the city will soon be home to five new pieces of art. The 5' tall guitars, painted by local artists, will be located in prominent areas around town for all to enjoy, including San Jacinto Plaza, Ted Cain's Corner Park, City Hall, Harry Myers Park and The Harbor. 2018 Water Quality Report

Since 2007, the City of Rockwall has earned a superior rating for its water system. This is the highest ranking that can be achieved, and it means that the water system exceeds the requirements for safe drinking water. According to state records, only about 15% earn the superior rating.

The Consumer Confidence Report (CCR) is an annual summary of the quality of drinking water provided by the City of Rockwall. The CCR lists all the federally regulated or monitored contaminants that have been found in the drinking water. The EPA requires water systems to test for up to 97 contaminants, and Rockwall's drinking water meets or exceeds all federal (EPA) drinking water requirements.
