

#### **Hazardous Waste Changes Coming**

The City of Rockwall has partnered with a new local company, HHW Solutions, Inc., to provide service for household hazardous materials, and the system is expected to be more convenient for residents than the previous once-a-year method.

Starting June 1, City of Rockwall residents will be able to call and schedule a porch pickup of hazardous materials—at their own home. The same types of items can be disposed as before.



Pickup will be scheduled each Wednesday on

a first come first served basis. And once the weekly spots are filled, the resident will be scheduled for the following Wednesday. Please see the attached insert for more information about the new process.

### Love Your Landscaping... Caring for Your Trees

Trees are a great addition to any landscape. And there are a few simple rules to follow to keep them beautiful for years to come. For starters, proper pruning is crucial to a healthy tree. It's key to remember that trees should be trimmed for corrective or preventive issues and not for aesthetics. Any and all cuts are still serious wounds to the tree.

- A tree should never be "topped" for any reason.
- Trees need additional fertilization like the rest of your landscape.
- A tree is not dead just because the leaves turn brown.
- Never prune your tree during a drought, unless there is a hazard or safety concern.
- Most importantly: Water, water, water!
