Rockwall FD Successfully Completes COVID-19 Vaccines

The man said that without a doubt the Rockwall vaccination site was the most efficient and well-run operation of any he had encountered across the state—and that's why he had returned to receive his own shots here.

One of the extra special guests who had been vaccinated at the RFD shot clinic was Ms. Alice, who is 108 years young! She charmed volunteers, who were honored to provide this service to help keep her happy and healthy for many years to come.
