

# **Rockwall Prepares to Celebrate Independence Day**

Every year, residents in Rockwall turn out for a patriotic Fourth of July celebration. It's a fun-filled day with activities for the whole family. And in true Rockwall form, this year's event is shaping up to be one of the best.

As in years past, the parade starts at Wilkerson-Sanders Memorial Stadium, winds through Historic Downtown Rockwall and ends at Dobbs Elementary.

Later that evening, the celebration moves to Harry Myers Park. # **New Councilmembers Sworn In**

Three City Councilmembers, including two incumbents and one new member, have been sworn in for the Rockwall City Council in Places 2, 4, and 6. Because no Council positions were opposed this time, the election was cancelled.

New to the Council, is former Rockwall Police Chief Mark Moeller (pictured above left), who was sworn in for his two year term in Place 2, vacated by John Hohenshelt, who termed out this year after more than six years on the Council.

Also sworn in was returning Councilmember Trace Johannesen (pictured above middle), who takes the seat for another two year term in Place 4. The City Council selected Mr. Johannesen to serve as the Mayor Pro-Tem for the coming year.

Incumbent Councilmember Anna Campbell (above right) was sworn in for another two year term in Place 6.

The Consumer Confidence Report (CCR) is an annual summary of the quality of drinking water the City of Rockwall provides to customers. The CCR lists all the federally regulated or monitored contaminants that have been found in the drinking water. The EPA requires water systems to test for up to 97 contaminants. Our drinking water meets or exceeds all federal (EPA) drinking water requirements.
