The new project includes infrastructure development for 210 acres of REDC land. This land helps the REDC diversify the Rockwall tax base, by attracting new businesses to the area.



North Texas Municipal Water District Board Changes

With all the emphasis on water these days, the North Texas Municipal Water District (NTMWD) has come into prominence of late. Specifically of note, there have been some key changes with the City of Rockwall's representatives on the NTMWD Board of Directors. After nearly three decades, one representative has retired from his role, and a familiar face is stepping into his place.

Larry Parks has served since 1993 in various roles on the NTMWD Board of Directors, including President twice. Mr. Parks, a former banker and longtime Rockwall resident, is stepping down to enjoy retirement with his family. NTMWD Executive Director Jenna Covington thanked Mr. Parks for his many decades of service through much change, including building a new reservoir, four new water plants, and expansions of the three largest regional wastewater plants.

Former Rockwall City Manager Rick Crowley was selected to fill the role. He retired in 2020 after 42 years of municipal service, with 37 of those in the City of Rockwall. During his tenure, he served in several key roles, including Director of Public Works, Director of Municipal Services, Assistant City Manager, and City Manager from 2012-2020. Mr. Crowley's vast experience with water and wastewater utilities for the City makes him well suited for this new role.

Explore the Great Outdoors in Rockwall Parks

There are so many ways to appreciate nature in the City of Rockwall. The Parks and Recreation system has eight butterfly gardens where residents can visit, observe and enjoy the beautiful butterflies. Seven of the gardens are designated as Monarch Waystations, or pollinator gardens, and one is a butterfly prairie meadow. Additionally, the Pettinger Nature Preserve provides three outdoor educational classrooms for residents to use at any time, free of charge. Operating hours at all Rockwall parks are 5 a.m.-10 p.m. The classrooms have been used by RISD science teachers to allow students an opportunity to spend quality time in the great outdoors. Residents are encouraged to put on their walking shoes, grab a camera, and explore the beauty all around!
