

Heroes Honored for Saving a Life at Rockwall Farmers Market

Mayor Trace Johannesen and the Rockwall City Council recognized a large group of employees recently – with a "Life-Saving Award" for working together to save the life of a Farmers Market vendor.

While setting up for the market, Farmer John (of State 28 Farm) suffered a cardiac arrest, and thankfully Rockwall Parks & Recreation employee Bryan Escobar jumped into action to perform CPR. Soon after, fellow Parks employee Daniel Ramirez joined in to help. After 9-1-1 was called, Rockwall Police Officer Garrett Stewart took over chest compressions.



Next, Captain Lewis Johnson and Firefighters Bogdan

Rusmanica and Clay Crawford, along with Rockwall County EMS personnel defibrillated the man. He was transported to a local hospital and was able to walk out after a short stay—even after a diagnosis of Sudden Cardiac Death!

Of note, as the patient left, the fire personnel as well as Police Sergeant Jose Urive, and Officers Sonja Doss, Cameron Parker and Aaron Woolverton packed up Farmer John's market booth, and located the keys, then loaded all the products onto the vendor's vehicle.

As City Manager, Mary Smith (who was on scene helping during the market) said, "Farmer John lives today, thanks to this group of dedicated people willing and able to jump into action and do the right thing. I can't emphasize enough the importance of getting CPR training—today."

# DriveTexas.Org Offers Way to Manage I-30 Traffic Frustrations

The end may not quite be in sight yet to the frustration of driving on I-30 between Rockwall and Dallas—but you can definitely be more proactive before you head out on the road. Admittedly, it can be maddening to sit in traffic on the bridge, and now with the construction on I-30, that problem is exacerbated. Take note: There are a couple of tools you can utilize to plan for the drive ahead.

DriveTexas.org is a helpful TxDOT website that lets you navigate directly to the road you're traveling, and the website will provide accurate and timely information about driving conditions. The information on this website is updated frequently and covers all roads maintained by TxDOT.

## Love Your Landscape - Dealing with Drought

Now that we are getting closer to fall, we hope to see more rain than we have in the past few months. All summer we've suffered through extreme temperatures and severe drought conditions... and so have our plants.

The good news is that landscape plants are resilient, so don't give up on them just yet. In case the plants can be salvaged, here are a few steps you can take to help your landscape recover:

1. Water as needed, but don't overdo it. Watering too much to catch up can be just as harmful as the drought.

2. Be careful with fertilizer. Keep application rates low and use slow-release fertilizer, because stressed plants cannot use the fertilizer efficiently, and it causes them to need even more water.

3. Your lawn and trees know when to start going into summer dormancy due to extreme temperatures and lack of rain to protect themselves. This means trees will drop older outer leaves and grass will turn brown.



4. Finally, wait until spring to see if the plant comes out of winter dormancy before considering it lost, unless it is very obvious it is dead.
