🛓 INTERSTATE 30 UPDATES

TxDOT is launching significant projects in Rockwall, including the widening of Interstate bridges over John King Blvd and FM 3549/Stodghill Rd. These upgrades will involve adding lanes in the center of the existing bridges. Moreover, both eastbound and westbound frontage roads between Ridge Road and Hwy 205 will undergo transformations. TxDOT will lay down temporary pavement to facilitate traffic while the current roads are being revamped. The new frontage roads will feature enhanced drainage systems and sidewalks. The substructure for the I-30 eastbound frontage road is nearing completion, and construction over the lake will soon begin to shape the new lanes. Meanwhile, drilling has started on the westbound frontage road. Residents should expect various lane closures on I-30 and the adjoining frontage roads as these expansions and improvements take place. 12 Days of Safety

'Tis the season for joy, laughter, and festive cheer—but it's also the perfect time to prioritize safety.

- 1. Three Feet, Please! Keep decorations a safe distance from flames.
- 2. Safe Cords, Happy Floors! Avoid hiding cords under rugs or leaving them where they can trip someone.
- 3. Hydrate Your Tree! Water real trees daily and dispose of them promptly after Christmas to prevent them from drying out.
- 4. Lights Out for Bedtime! Turn off holiday lights before you hit the hay-most fires happen at night.
- 5. Avoid Outlet Overload. Don't overuse extension cords; install extra outlets if needed.
- 6. Smoke Alarms! Make sure every floor and bedroom has one, and don't forget to test them.
- 7. Space Heaters Need Space. Keep them at least three feet from anything flammable.
- 8. Inspect Decorations. Check for frayed wires or damaged items.
- 9. Batteries are not Snacks. Store them safely, as kids and pets might mistake them for toys or treats.
- Pet Safety Alert! Keep holiday plants like poinsettias and mistletoe out of reach—they can be toxic to animals.
- 11.Stay Cool in the Kitchen. Never leave cooking unattended; distractions can quickly turn dangerous.
- 12.Logs Only! Only burn appropriate materials in the fireplace, and store ashes in a metal bin far from the house.

As the holidays approach, it's important to remember to Cease the Grease and keep our drains clean! Fats, oils, and grease (FOG) from cooking can build up in pipes, leading to costly clogs and overflows. When FOG goes down the

drain, it hardens and can cause raw sewage to back up into homes, streets, and even nearby waterways, impacting our environment and drinking water. To avoid damage, never pour grease down the drain. Instead, soak up small amounts with paper towels and toss them in the trash. For larger amounts, cool the grease, then dispose of it in a sealed container. Keep your drains safe and clean this season!



Winter is Coming... So Should Your Permit

With winter weather just around the corner, many homeowners may be considering HVAC installations or roofing repairs to prepare their homes for the colder months. Please remember that certain HVAC work and roofing projects require permits from the City of Rockwall. These permits help ensure that the work meets safety standards and complies with local codes,, protecting your home and family. Before starting any project, check with the City's Building Inspections Department to obtain the necessary permits and stay prepared for the season ahead.
