Keeping Your Streets Clear

You may have noticed companies hired by electric and phone providers out and about trimming around lines in the area.

Did you know? Homeowners in Rockwall are required to trim their overhanging trees and bushes to keep them clear of the public right of way. This includes keeping limbs from obstructing views of intersections and street signs. Here are a few tips:

- Maintain a minimum clearance of 12 feet above streets and alleys.
- Maintain a minimum clearance of eight feet above sidewalks.
- Shrubs and trees must not encroach upon streets or alleys.

TxDOT is launching significant projects in Rockwall, including the widening of Interstate bridges over John King Blvd and FM 3549/Stodghill Rd. These upgrades will involve adding lanes in the center of the existing bridges. Moreover, both eastbound and westbound frontage roads between Ridge Road and Hwy 205 will undergo transformations. TxDOT will lay down temporary pavement to tacilitate traffic while the current roads are being revamped. The new frontage roads will feature enhanced drainage systems and sidewalks. The substructure for the I-30 eastbound frontage road is nearing completion, and construction over the lake will soon begin to shape the new lanes. Meanwhile, drilling has started on the westbound frontage road. Residents should expect various lane closures on I-30 and the adjoining frontage roads as these expansions and improvements take place. The new year is the perfect time to prepare your landscape and equipment for a successful spring season. Start by sharpening or replacing your lawn mower blade, and don't forget to change the oil and air filter to ensure your mower runs smoothly. It's also a great time to thoroughly inspect your irrigation system and make any necessary repairs before the growing season begins.

Before March 1st, focus on pruning your trees, cutting back ornamental grasses and perennial plants, and planting any new trees or shrubs. Mid to late February is also the ideal window to apply pre-emergent herbicide to prevent pesky spring and summer weeds.

Go Big or Go Home: Did you know the Bur Oak tree produces the largest acorn of any native Oak in Texas—just one more reason to consider this majestic tree for your landscape!
